- Ozarks Electric Cooperative Youth Tour Each year, Ozarks Electric Cooperative sends two area high school juniors to visit Washington, D.C. at no charge to the student. This program, called Youth Tour, is sponsored by electric cooperatives all over the nation. Youth Tour was created to allow students the opportunity to visit our nation's capital and see firsthand how our government works. Last year, Youth Tour participants were able to visit national monuments and memorials, Smithsonian Museums, Monticello, Mount Vernon and meet with their state's representatives and senators. As in years past, Ozarks Electric pays for all lodging, transportation and meals for the students selected for Youth Tour. The selection process for Youth Tour 2018 is currently underway. ### **College and Career Information:**

- Confused about how to begin the college selection/application/scholarship/financial aid process for next year? Juniors and parents of juniors who would like to get a jump start on college planning may contact Mrs. Zeagler to schedule a personal college consultation. Appointments are available during the school day as well as before or after school. Students

- The Office of Diversity Affairs in the Walton College is accepting applications for several summer programs listed below. All are one-week residency programs where students will be living in a co-educational residential facility. The deadline to apply is March 30 and students will be notified of their acceptance by April 15. Application can be found at this [link](#)  
**Fleischer Scholars Program I** - June 10-15, 2018. Rising juniors and seniors chosen to participate will work in teams to develop business plans and work with business professionals to gain greater understanding of the business world. Completers will have the opportunity to apply to receive a \$40,000 to attend the University of Arkansas Walton College of Business.  
**Technology Awareness Program** - June 17-22, 2018. Designed to introduce underrepresented 11th and 12th grade students to the field of computer information systems.  
**Fleischer Scholars Program II** - June 24-29, 2018. For former Fleischer Scholars I completers. These students will be engaging in an unpaid internship to gain valuable hands on experience in an area of business that interests them as well as leadership development and skills training to prepare them for college.  
**Accounting Career Awareness Program** - July 15-20, 2018. Designed to introduce underrepresented rising high school juniors and seniors to accounting and business careers. ACAP students will attend undergraduate-level classes and network with accounting professionals from local companies.
- The National Youth Science Camp will be held this summer from June 27 through July 21. Two high school seniors from each state will receive a full scholarship to exchange ideas with scientists and other professionals from academic, governmental and corporate worlds. The nearly month-long experience includes lectures and hands-on research projects presented by scientists from across the nation; overnight outdoor trips into the Monongahela National Forest; and a visit to Washington D.C. The selected delegates must not only demonstrate academic achievement in science, but also show potential for thoughtful scientific leadership. The NYSCamp experience is offered at no cost to its participants, so that selected delegates may attend regardless of their financial status. Contributions to the National Youth Science Foundation allow delegates to participate in this "once in a lifetime" experience. Educational and recreational programming, as well as meals, lodging, and round-trip air travel are provided free of charge. Delegates arrive in Charleston, West Virginia, on Wednesday, June 27, and depart on Saturday, July 21, 2018. The NYSCamp is held near Bartow in the eastern mountains of West Virginia, within the Monongahela National Forest. The application process is available on the NYSCamp website at <http://apply.nysc.org> Applications must be submitted by Wednesday, February 28 by 6:00 pm.
- All students who qualify for Free and Reduced Lunch are eligible to receive a fee waiver for one SAT and ACT during their junior year as well as an additional fee waiver for both tests during their senior year. Also included in the ACT fee waiver is complimentary online ACT preparation. SAT preparation is free to all students online through [KHAN ACADEMY](#) Students may pick up a fee waiver from their counselor or from the College and Career Center.
- Seniors, please check the scholarship list in your Family Connection Account on Naviance regularly. Each scholarship received by the College and Career Center will be posted here along with the qualifications and links to each scholarship application. To get to the scholarship list, log into Naviance, select the "College" tab at the top of the page and then select "scholarship list" at the bottom of the

- The Free Application for Federal Student Aid for the 2018-19 school year is now open and accepting applications. Students who are current seniors will use this FAFSA. The FAFSA is used and required for many post-secondary funding opportunities including the Arkansas Academic Challenge Scholarship funded by the Arkansas Lottery (also known as the "Lottery Scholarship"). The deadline to complete the 2018-19 FAFSA is June 1, 2018. Once a student files the FAFSA, that student should receive a Student Aid Report within three to five days indicating the Expected Family Contribution (or how much the family is expected to pay for the student's education). - ACT Prep courses taught by Bryan Hembree, Director of ACT Outreach for the University of Arkansas will be held throughout the school year to correspond with the October, December and April test dates. The cost is \$180 for 12 hours of instruction. The cost is \$40 for students who qualify for free and reduced lunch.
