- All students who qualify for Free and Reduced Lunch are eligible to receive a fee waiver for one SAT and ACT during their junior year as well as an additional fee waiver for both tests during their senior year. Also included in the ACT fee waiver is complimentary online ACT preparation. SAT preparation is free to all students online through [KHAN ACADEMY](#). Students may pick up a fee waiver from their counselor or from the College and Career Center.

Naviance is a web-based platform designed especially for students, parents, teachers and counselors to assist students in making decisions about courses, colleges and careers. Students can access their Naviance account from any computer or other electronic device. This week in EDGE, 12th grade students will be introduced to the Career Key Assessment which will assist students in determining what careers they might be good at in the future by helping them identify their interests, traits, skills and abilities. This is one of many assessments scheduled for seniors this year that will assist them in choosing their own personal post-secondary plan. Zeagler for the opportunity to apply for their Hamilton Prize for Creativity, a four-year tuition scholarship worth over \$200,000. Deadline to apply is January 1, 2018.

- The Free Application for Federal Student Aid for the 2018-19 school year is now open and accepting applications. Students who are current seniors will use this FAFSA. The FAFSA is used and required for many post-secondary funding opportunities including the Arkansas Academic Challenge Scholarship funded by the Arkansas Lottery (also known as the "Lottery Scholarship"). The deadline to complete the 2018-19 FAFSA is June 1, 2018. Once a student files the FAFSA, that student should receive a Student Aid Report within three to five days indicating the Expected Family Contribution (or how much the family is expected to pay for the student's education). - ACT Prep courses taught by Bryan Hembree, Director of ACT Outreach for the University of Arkansas will be held throughout the school year to correspond with the October, December and April test dates. The cost is \$180 for 12 hours of instruction. The cost is \$40 for students who qualify for free and reduced lunch.
