Naviance is a web-based platform designed especially for students, parents, teachers and counselors to assist students in making decisions about courses, colleges and careers. Students can access their Naviance account from any computer or other electronic device. This week in EDGE, 12th grade students will be introduced to the Career Key Assessment which will assist students in determining what careers they might be good at in the future by helping them identify their interests, traits, skills and abilities. - The Free Application for Federal Student Aid for the 2018-19 school year is now open and accepting applications. Students who are current seniors will use this FAFSA. The FAFSA is used and required for many post-secondary funding opportunities including the Arkansas Academic Challenge Scholarship funded by the Arkansas Lottery (also known as the "Lottery Scholarship"). The deadline to complete the 2018-19 FAFSA is June 1, 2018. Once a student files the FAFSA, that student should receive a Student Aid Report within three to five days indicating the Expected Family Contribution (or how much the family is expected to pay for the student's education).
