## SUMMARY

### SETTING

Fayetteville, with a population of approximately 80,000, is located in the Ozark Mountains of Northwest Arkansas. Fayetteville is home to the main campus of the University of Arkansas. Northwest Arkansas is home to the headquarters of Wal-Mart, Tyson Foods, and JB Hunt Transport.

### THE SCHOOL

Fayetteville High School (FHS) is a public, four-year high school. Student enrollment for grades 9-12 is approximately 2570. The senior class of 2016 has 552 students. Approximately 31% of students qualify for the federal free and reduced lunch. FHS also offers the Agee-Lierly Life Preparation Services Center (ALLPS) to meet the needs of students needing an alternative education.

### Student Ethnicity:

Caucasian 72%, Hispanic 12%, African American 10%, Asian 4%, Native American 1%, Pacific Islander 1%

The school year is comprised of two 18 week semesters. Our school operates on a block-schedule with four 90 minute class periods on "A" days and four 90 minute class periods on "B" days. Students are required to enroll in and attend all eight periods (including advisory).

### Estimated College Attendance, Class of 2014-15:

61% attended a 4 year college/university

14% attended a 2 year technical/community college

## MARKING SYSTEM & GRADING SCALE

All courses are included in computing the GPA and class rank, with the exception of those grades marked as a "P" which designates a passing grade or "WP" or "WF" which designates a withdraw passing or withdraw fail grade. Fayetteville High School uses a 4.0 grading scale for all courses except advanced placement courses. Advanced placement courses are on a 5.0 grading scale. The minimum passing grade in any course is 60%. The least amount of credit awarded to any class that is passed is a .5. This indicates a class that meets for one semester. The grading scale and points are awarded as follows:

### GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

1 credit = 1 year. A minimum of 24 credits to graduate, comprising the following requirements:  
English 4.0; Math 4.0; Science 3.0; Social Studies 3.0;  
Fine Arts 0.5; Health 0.5; PE 0.5; Oral Communications 0.5;  
Career Electives 8.0.

### CONCURRENT CREDIT

Qualified students may take concurrent college classes and acquire college credit from the University of Arkansas and/or Northwest Arkansas Community College. One semester of college work counts as one full credit on a student transcript. Dual credit courses offered on campus include: College Algebra, Composition I and II.

### HONORS DIPLOMA REQUIREMENTS

Honors: 2 same world languages; 8 credits in courses qualifying for high/distinguished honors graduates. 3.50 GPA

High Honors: 2 same world languages; 5 math credits; 10 credits in courses qualifying for high/distinguished honors graduates. 3.75 GPA

Distinguished Honors: 2 same world languages; 5 math credits; 12 credits in courses qualifying for high/distinguished honors graduates. 4.00 GPA

### SUMMARY OF CLASS RANK CALCULATION

Students with a GPA above 4.0 are ranked #1. Students with a GPA =4.0 are ranked #2. Students with a 3.99 GPA and below are then ranked starting at #3. GPA and Class Rank are calculated at the end of each semester after 11th grade.

Please note that 100% of our students are ranked in the top 38% of their graduating class. This is due to identical GPA's receiving the same class rank and our number ordering policy.

## ADVANCED PLACEMENT

There is no limit to the number of AP or Pre-AP courses a student can take. However, only one AP course is offered for 9th Grade students (AP Human Geography) and one AP course for 10th Grade students (AP US History). There are a total of 10 Pre-AP courses offered and 26 AP courses are offered during the 2015-16 school year.
